Dear Mr. Bertram,

With your e-mail dated 7 December 2017 you enquired after a statement by Mr. A. van Houwelingen concerning 300 Jews in Delbrück the during the Second World War.

We have neither the statement of Mr. Van Houwelingen nor anything substantiating his claim. Mr. Van Houwelingen was in Amersfoort from 18 July to 4 August 1944 and sent to the Company Wilhelm Fix in Dernau (Massnahme Stephan). He worked here from 9 august to 21 september 1944.

I do recall my correspondence with Mr. Günckelhorn and that he too intially was sure there were 300 Jews from PDL Amersfoort in Arhtal. The list I provided him did not contain typically Jewish names. Nor is this likely; Jews were deported from JDL Westerbork to Sobibor and Auschwitz. From Amersfoort punished forced labourers were sent to people were sent to Germany for the Arbeitseinsatz.
